FROM THE ACTING ASSOCIATE PASTOR

As the weather cools and the days become shorter, my excitement for puzzles, hot tea and Christmas music rises considerably. If you've been in my office lately, you'll have noticed the puzzle on my table, traces of my tea consumption, and you might have caught me with some music on as well. These aren't just things I do to keep me busy in the cold months. Not only are they fun, but, more importantly, they are things I do to help center myself.

We aren't in a tradition that emphasizes the observation of Sabbath, but this is a spiritual practice that truly is a gift. Some traditions have put aside a specific day each week to honor and observe rest. If you are able, I would encourage you to pick a day each week to rest from your weekly work and do the things that you enjoy. Now, I'm aware that with all the things we have going on in our lives, taking a full day isn't necessarily a possibility right away. In my own experience, I've found that if I make time, even just 5 or 10 minutes here and there to intentionally do the things I love, it helps me better engage the work I have to do. It clears my mind and allows me to be present and productive. Thich Nhat Hanh writes about seeds, which can be an experience of Sabbath:

There are many kinds of seeds in us, both good and bad. Some were planted during our lifetime, and some were transmitted by our parents, our ancestors, and our society. Our ancestors and our parents have given us seeds of joy, peace, and happiness, as well as seeds of sorrow, anger, and so on.

Every time we practice mindful living, we plant healthy seeds and strengthen the healthy seeds already in us. Healthy seeds function similarly to antibodies. When a virus enters our bloodstream, our body reacts and antibodies come and surround it, take care of it, and transform it. This is true with our psychological seeds as well. If we plant wholesome, healing, refreshing seeds, they will take care of the negative seeds, even without our asking them. To succeed, we must cultivate a good reserve of refreshing seeds.

God gave us the gift of Sabbath. This month, why don't we try to receive that gift and begin finding ways to incorporate it into our weekly lives? Whether it's a full day or pieces of days throughout the whole week, let's see how observing Sabbath not only deepens our spiritual selves, but also reenergizes us for the different things to which we are called.

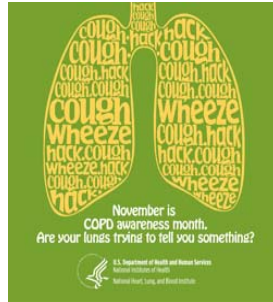


A NOTE FROM OUR PARISH NURSE

Are Your Lungs Trying To Tell You Something?

Do you often stop and rest because you're short of breath, wheezing, or coughing? Do you have trouble with simple daily tasks like climbing stairs, carrying groceries, or doing laundry? If this sounds like you, your lungs could be trying to tell you something. You could be experiencing symptoms of COPD (chronic obstructive pulmonary disease), a serious lung disease that over time makes it hard to breathe.

[Signs and symptoms of COPD](#) includes frequent shortness of breath, chronic cough, wheezing, chest tightness, and excessive phlegm (mucus) production. These are often ignored and dismissed as normal signs of aging or of being out of shape.



In recognition of National COPD Awareness Month:

- If you have signs and symptoms of COPD, talk to your doctor to see whether you should be tested for this serious lung disease.
- If you're a health professional, consider the diagnosis of COPD in adults who have these signs and symptoms.

Did you know?

- COPD is now the third leading cause of death in the United States. It claims more lives annually than breast cancer and diabetes combined.
- An estimated 24 million people in the United States have COPD, but half remain undiagnosed.
- COPD is not an "old person's disease." Half of all COPD patients are under age 65.
- Smoking is not the only cause of COPD. Long-term exposure to other lung irritants, such as air pollution, chemical fumes, or dust, also may contribute to COPD. Between 10 and 20 percent of people with COPD have never smoked.
- COPD kills more than 120,000 Americans each year. That's one death every 4 minutes.

With approximately 1 in 5 Americans over the age of 45 suffering from COPD, it's very likely that you know someone who has COPD but who may not know it!

BETHEL TEACHERS TRAINING CONCLUDING CONGREGATIONAL CLASSES TO BEGIN

Those people involved in the Bethel Teachers Training Classes are looking forward to beginning the preparation for the Congregational Classes. Teacher selection, class locations, and signing up class participants will be the next steps as we move into the congregational phase of the Bethel Bible Series.

The plans are to have at least six classes of 10 to 15 people. Some classes will be held at Immanuel, some will be held in the homes of members willing to host a class.

These in-home satellite classes will be held in some of the outlying neighborhoods for the convenience of members who live in West County and St. Charles County. The host family will provide the location, a Bethel Teacher will be assigned to each class, and class days and times will be mutually agreed upon by class members. The day and time for classes held at Immanuel will also be scheduled to fit in with other church activities. In this way, we hope to offer a variety of days, times, and places in order to include the greatest number of people in the exciting journey of the Bethel Bible Series.

The series is an overview of the Bible, Old and New Testaments. Each Testament is divided into three sessions, each lasting seven weeks. There will be a break between sessions. Commitment to attending all seven classes of each session is strongly recommended.

The tentative schedule is:

OLD TESTAMENT:

First Session: first week in January (2-7), 2012 through the third week in February (13-18), 2012
Break through Easter

Second Session: second week of April (9-14), 2012 through the third week of May (21-26), 2012
Break through Labor Day

Third Session: first week of September (4-8), 2012 through the third week of October (15-20), 2012
Break through New Year's Day

The fee for the class session is \$15.00. Fees will be payable at registration for the first session. At the end of the first session, registrations and fees will be payable for the second session. Please give prayerful consideration to enrolling in this special Bethel Bible Series experience!
